
Dear Mothers, Fathers, Carers and Local Residents

Y6 had different assessment systems this year based on the new more challenging National Curriculum. The percentage we have used indicates those children who have met or exceeded the expected standard.

Y6 SATS results – Reading – 80% (National 66%). Writing (SPAG) – 85% (National 72%) - Writing (Teacher Assessment) - 66% (National 74%) - and Maths 80% (National 70%)

We are so proud of everything the Y6 pupils have achieved and wish them all well as they move onto secondary school.
