Rewarding excellent behaviour:

Every term all children will again have the opportunity to earn their place at the end of term celebration. The School Council will choose future events.

Safeguarding Reminder:

Please remember that any adults, including parents, who enter the building, must do so via reception. You must be wearing a visitor's pass and have signed in before entering. Please do not attempt to enter through the pupil entrance in the mornings.

In addition, we have now introduced a pupil signing out sheet in reception. Parents and carers must complete this if they are collecting their child before the end of the day.

Welcome message from our Family Link & Pastoral Support Worker:

Hello, I am Nkoyo Antigha. My role at Wicklea is to support pupils and parents with any worries, anxieties and issues. This may involve me working with you directly or to signpost you to other agencies or resources that could help or support you. Each week there will be a sign up sheet in reception for parents/carers to book a short initial meeting to discuss any safeguarding or family support needs. The sheet will detail the slots for the particular week (this may vary). Please note if you have concerns relating to learning you should still contact your child's teacher. If you have concerns relating to SEN you should still contact Mrs Harrison, our Senco.

Exceptional leave of absence:

Our whole school attendance target this year is 97%. As a school, we aim high in everything we do and high attendance gives children the best chance of reaching their potential. We are able to administer prescribed medicines so children can be in school while on medication.

Moving forwards, we will be being tougher on holidays, in line with our attendance policy and it is unlikely any holidays will be authorised, even if it includes visiting unwell family or family weddings, as children do get 13 weeks school holidays spread over the year. Leave of absence must be exceptional to be authorised.
